Secure now; upgrade and transform when ready End of support for SQL Server 2008 and 2008 R2 is July 9, 2019

If you're running SQL Server 2008 or 2008 R2, these versions are reaching the end of their support lifecycle. Each version is backed by a minimum of 10 years of support (5 years for Mainstream Support and 5 years for Extended Support) including regular security updates. End of support means the end of security updates, which can cause security and compliance issues and put applications and business at risk. We recommend upgrading to current versions for the most advanced security, performance, and innovation. For customers that can't get it all upgraded by the deadline, new options help protect applications and data during the upgrade transition.

Migrate your database to Azure

Running current versions of software enables you to benefit from the latest security, performance, and innovation features, as well as regular security updates.

If you cannot upgrade to the latest version before the deadline, however, rehost workloads in Azure and get three years of Extended Security Updates at no additional charge. Gain these benefits:
